GREAT STAFF = EXCELLENCE IN TEACHING!

I want to give a great shout out to our wonderful staff at St Joseph's. On Friday 31st October we celebrate World Teacher's Day. Our children are blessed to have such a caring and cohesive team of professional Teachers and Support Teachers.

I also include in this list of teachers Fr Mark Croker. Fr Mark is here every Wednesday to support staff and children in their faith and life learnings. I am aware that parents can become concerned with the lack of male staff in school. Don't be! Current research highlights the trend in Australian education with the steady decline of male teachers across all levels. Men make up just 2% of early childhood educators, 18% in primary schools, and around 40% in high schools. Projections from Macquarie University suggest male teachers could vanish from government schools by 2054, and become entirely "extinct" by 2067.

But does gender really impact student outcomes?

Findings from University researchers McGrath et al. show that **teacher gender has no measurable effect on academic performance**.

Studies also challenge the notion that "male teachers should act as surrogate father figures, calling it unrealistic and potentially harmful to both educators and students.." In Catholic Education we always value parents and carers as the first educators of their children.

So what matters most?

Quality teaching

Our staff provide excellence in education. Recently I was speaking to a past parent who made the comment: "I wish we could take your teachers and learning with us!" What a wonderful acknowledgement of St Joseph's staff and the care and instruction they provide.

We proudly follow in the footsteps of the Sisters of St Joseph who, for generations, educated rural children and supported their families.



Big change coming! From mid December, under 16s won't be able to have accounts on some social media platforms.

More young people are making reports to eSafety when experiencing online harms. No one should have to deal with it solo, support is always there.

IN FOCUS: SEXTORTION



Sextortion is a form of blackmail where someone threatens to share a nude or sexual image or video of you unless you give in to their demands.



WHAT CAN YOU DO?

Tell someone you trust and report it straight away. Under 18s can report to ACCCE, 18+ can report it to the platform. If the image or video is shared report it to eSafety.

THINGS TO THINK ABOUT

Blackmailers can be anyone (strangers or peers) so be mindful of who you meet and talk to online. They can hide behind fake profiles.

Stop all contact and do not pay the blackmailer or give them more money or intimate content.

Keep the receipts - take screenshots, photos or screen recordings of messages and profiles so you have evidence to report.

It's never your fault. You're not alone and help is always there.

- Cyberbullying reports to eSafety have increased by 450% in the last 5 years.
- 1 in 3 young women and 1 in 5 young men have experienced online sexual harassment.
- Australia's eSafety Commissioner is a world-first government regulator focused solely on online safety.

Students are encouraged to wear red on Friday of week 3 to support the Daniel Morcombe Foundation. Students will be completing activities within their classrooms on child safety.



Rural and regional school travel

Apply online for free school travel in rural and regional NSW. You only need to complete one form, even for journeys using more than one operator.

Who can apply?

Tobe eligible for freeschool travel, students may need to live a minimum distance from their school:

Years K-2 (Infants)

There is no minimum distance.

Years 3-6 (Primary)

More than 1.6km straight line distance or at least 2.3km walking.

Years 7-12 (Secondary)

More than 2.0km straight line distance or at least 2.9km walking.

Who needs to apply

You only need to apply if the student has never been approved for free school travel before. Students in a shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody) should submit a separate application for both addresses.

How to update your details

You need to update student details online if the student is changing their name, address, school or campus, or their Transport operator. You can update them at transportnsw.info/ssts-update

Frequently asked questions

Does the approved free travelin clude travel outsideschoolhours?

Approved free school travel is only for travel to and from school. So for travel after hours, on weekends or duringschool holidays, students will need to buy a ticket.

What if there's no public transport in my area?

Inareas where thereisnopublic transport, you may be able to get asubsidy for driving the student to school. Fordetails, visit transportnsw.info/school-students

How do I apply if the student needs to travel from two addresses because the parents live separately?

Each parent (or the student if aged 16 or over) needs to apply separately for each address. The same minimum distances apply.

How to apply for free travel for the

first time
You can apply for free school travelfornextyear from the start of Term 4 this year.

Step 1

Once you have enrolled your child at the new school, apply online by giving your home address and telling us which bus company the student needs to travel with between home and school. You can apply online at transportnsw.info/school-students

Step 2

The school then confirms to us that your details are correct.

Step 3

We will then work on your application. You will get an email confirming if the student is approved for free travel. If so, we will tell your local bus company who may send a school travel pass (if needed) to your school or, in some cases, the bus company will contact you directly about travel arrangements.

A parent or guardian must apply for students aged 15 years and under. Students who are 16 years and

overmust apply for themselves.
